
RSA Bronze Award

We are very proud to share with all of our parents and members of the Nechells Community that Nechells Primary have achieved two awards this half term that recognise our hard work and commitment to 'opening doors and opening minds.'

This academic year we have empowered our children through increasing their opportunities to be leaders and be voted to represent their classes in a range of councils set up in school. Our Eco-Council have been working since September to improve the school and local community environments. They have taken part in a community litter pick and then transferred these skills into school with a weekly litter pick on the school grounds. They meet every Thursday to do an environment audit to look at our energy consumption and recycling across school. Through our half termly meetings with key adults in school they have written an action plan and want to reduce the number of cars on the road by campaigning for a bike rack in school so that they can ride to school. Their next project is to increase the plants and wildlife in the school grounds.

Our Pupil Ambassadors are leading the way in ensuring that all children understand the United Conventions of the Rights of the Child. They have contributed to assemblies, reviewed the local road conditions and have written to the Highways Agency and MP to look at road improvements that can make Eliot Street and Crompton Road safer by reducing the speed on the roads. Through their work they have achieved the bronze award and are now working towards the silver award.
