It is not safe to walk along the road on Eliot street as many buses, lorries and large vans travel down this road throughout the day. It is not safe to also stop in the middle of the road and allow your children to leave your car and run to the school gate. Please support us in keeping everyone safe.

We realise it can be expensive to replace lost items, so can I ask parents to print their child's name and year group on children's uniforms and PE kits so the items can be returned promptly.



Omegle is an app and a website and last week there was a lot of reporting in regards to a surge in usage, particularly teens and younger children.

The BBC have reported that they carried out an investigation and found a significant amount of disturbing content.

Omegle is an app which openly advertises 'come in and talk to a stranger'. You simply click a button and you are placed in a video chat room with a completely random person. There are no age verifications on the app and no warnings. Children may be exposed to harmful, adult or inappropriate content.


