
I would like to wish you all a relaxing and safe weekend and look forward to seeing you on Monday morning.

### **Road safety**

Following the installation of scaffolding on Eliot street, the footpath has been closed for your safety. We would like to ask parents not to walk along the scaffolding in the road, as this puts yourself and your child at risk of harm.

Please also consider where you park if travelling to school by car. There have been numerous incidents whereby cars stop in the middle of the road to allow children to exit. This is not safe. Please find an appropriate place to park and walk your child to the academy gates.


Moving forward Police Community Support Officers will be patrolling Eliot street and Crompton road to ensure that dangerous parking does not place our children in danger.

### When the time comes to teach your child about crossing the road, remember the following:

- always set a good example by choosing a safe place to cross and explain what you're doing
- let your child help you decide where and when it's safe to cross
- explain that you should not try to cross a road between parked cars; drivers won't be able to see you very well and the cars might start moving
- use the Green Cross Code with your child explain that you have to stop at the kerb, then look both ways and listen for traffic before crossing
- when it's safe to cross, walk straight across the road and keep looking and listening out for traffic
- make sure that anyone else looking after your child follows the same road safety rules that you do
