How do I know what my child is learning?

Prior to a new half term, pupils will have a set of new Knowledge Organisers; this details the core knowledge pupils will be learning as well as the vocabulary that pupils will need to know. Pupils are encouraged to learn these as they support them to know more and remember more.

How do I know how well my child is learning?

We hold regular parents' evenings (at least one each term) to share with parents the progress that pupils are making. In addition to this, every year we send a school report which details the progress that pupils are making. This will also contain any assessment information for your child. Parents are welcome at the end of the school day to speak to staff about their child's learning and can make an appointment with their child's class teacher at any time by contacting the school office.

What is radicalisation?

Radicalisation is when someone starts to believe or support extreme views. They could be pressured to do things illegal by someone else. Or they might change their behaviour and beliefs.

This could happen if they feel:

- isolated and lonely or wanting to belong
- unhappy about themselves and what others might think of them
- embarrassed or judged about their culture, gender, religion or race
- stressed or depressed
- fed up of being bullied or treated badly by other people or by society
- angry at other people or the government
- confused about what they are doing
- pressured to stand up for other people who are being oppressed.

Someone who has been radicalised might believe that sexual, religious or racial violence is OK. They may be influenced by what they see online. They might have links to extreme groups that preach hate like Nazi groups or Islamic extremists like Daesh, also known as ISIS or IS.


